Description: The church of the Holy Trinity at Holdgate dates back to the Norman period (1066-1154), like the castle that once stood in the village. The church at Holdgate includes a Sheela Na Gig. These are stone carvings of a female figure which are sometimes found on Norman churches, but which may be of earlier Celtic or pagan origin.
