Forum Statement of House Constitution Subcommittee Ranking Member Trent Franks Regarding the Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act Thursday, July 10, 2008, 8:00 a.m. in 2237 Rayburn

We are holding this forum today to discuss a piece of bipartisan legislation I had hoped would have been addressed in the House Subcommittee on the Constitution, Civil Rights, and Civil Liberties, a subcommittee on which I serve as Ranking Member.

On April 7, I sent a letter to the Chairman of that subcommittee, Jerrold Nadler requesting that he hold an official hearing on the Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act, H.R. 1063. That bill would prohibit the transportation of minors across state lines by others who seek to circumvent state abortion involvement laws that require the notification or consent of a parent before an abortion can be performed. A made that request in a bipartisan spirit, as similar legislation passed the House of Representatives last Congress by a vote of 270 to 157 with strong bipartisan support.

I pointed out in my letter that this legislation is strongly supported by the American people. When one CBS News poll asked respondents "Would you favor or oppose requiring that at least one parent be told before a girl under 18 years of age could have an abortion?" 80% responded "Favor." And when a Fox News/Opinion Dynamics Poll asked "Do you think a female under age 18 should be required by state law to notify at least one parent or guard-ian before having an abortion?" 78% responded "Yes," including 64% of those who identified themselves as "pro-choice."

As this issue relates to the interstate transportation of minors across state lines for the purpose of circumventing valid state parental involvement laws, it is an issue that can only be addressed by Congress. Consequently, I was gravely disappointed when Chairman Nadler refused to respond to both my original April 7 letter and my May 16 follow-up on my request.

What that suggests to me is a deep division between the political parties regarding how each views parental rights, concerns for young women's health, and the unborn. Republicans believe that parents should be allowed to know when a potentially dangerous medical procedure is performed on their minor daughters. The Democratic leadership apparently does not. And when the Constitution plainly allows Congress to prevent the circumvention of valid state parental involvement laws, the Democratic leadership refuses to even hold a hearing on that pressing subject, despite overwhelming popular opinion supporting legislative action.

About half of the states, including my own state of Arizona, currently have such parental involvement laws. Yet abortion clinics, such as those in the newspaper advertisements displayed behind me, encourage the circumventing of these state laws. One of the purposes of the Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act is to prevent people - including abusive boyfriends and older men who may have committed rape -- from pressuring young girls into circumventing their state's parental involvement laws by receiving a secret out-of-state abortion.

Nothing in CIANA prevents a minor from obtaining an abortion. CIANA simply protects the right of parents to be given a chance to help their children through difficult times.

Even Dr. Bruce A. Lucero, an abortion provider, has supported this legislation because "parents are usually the ones who can best help their teenager consider her options."

A while ago I received a telephone call from the development office of my *alma mater*, the University of Connecticut School of Medicine. I had a pleasant chat with a young medical student. Of course he was asking (and hoping) that I would make a donation.

I explained to him that because of the Medical School's vigorous and continued support of human embryonic stem cell research (ESCR) I could no longer in good conscience support the Medical School.

It had pained me greatly to come to this decision, I told the student. I knew that the Medical School does much good and I knew that the education that I received there was excellent so I wished that other students could have a similar opportunity.

However with the Medical School's commitment to human ESCR, it was painfully evident to me that things had changed significantly since I studied there.

I had been taught that the foundation of medical ethics rested on the principles of "First, do no harm" and the Judeo-Christian Golden Rule ("Do unto others as you would have them do unto you"). I also learned that as a physician it was essential to have an attitude of hope towards life and that if there was any doubt we should always err on the side of life rather than joining with death.

The student listened patiently as I pointed out that human ESCR involves killing innocent human persons (who just happen to be embryos). I asked him how can it be that the Medical School is teaching and showing students through its research programs that it is ethical to take the lives of innocent persons for medical experiments? Especially when the persons involved are small, weak and defenseless?

The student had no reply but I really did not expect one. My purpose was rather to get the student thinking more about this issue of who is human and therefore deserving of the protection of human rights, the first and most basic of which is the right to life.

If we as a society, in the same way as the Medical School, start deciding that some innocent persons deserve the right to life while others do not, then doesn't our society quickly degenerate into a situation where the big, the strong and the powerful autocratically rule in what becomes the jungle?

Citizens Opposing Planned Parenthood (COPP) works to expose the destructive, evil agenda of Planned Parenthood. Although PP is non-profit, it makes a lot of money.

Planned Parenthood must promote promiscuity in order to profit financially. They make no money from those that are abstinent; therefore, if they teach abstinence it will be detrimental to business. Planned Parenthood of Northern New England (PPNNE) operates in Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont, and their mission statement is "to provide, promote, and protect access to reproductive health care and sexuality education, so that all people can make voluntary choices about their reproductive and sexual health". Read that again; do you think the State should fund that purpose with taxpayer money? They are not trying to wipe out cancer or disease, but "protect access to reproductive health care and sexuality education".

Right now, PPNNE has a contract with the State of New Hampshire worth \$1.1 million per year!! \$1.1 million tax dollars per year. In 2004 PPNNE's tax return shows over \$9 million in "net assets or fund balances at end of year". In the same year their medical director made over \$170,000 and the President/CEO made almost \$150,000.

They made over \$9 million dollars in 2004 and with money comes power. In New Hampshire, they use their power to:

- 1. **P**romote unrestricted sex to create a market for their services. On December 6, 2006 they gave out free "emergency contraception" in all 7 clinics in the state. They encouraged male and female clients to get some to "have on hand." Most of their business is from girls and women under the age of 25. One reason they can claim to serve low-income women, is because many of them are still in school, and therefore young and not making a lot of money.
- Fight legislation requiring parental notification or consent of abortion or emergency contraception for a minor child. They want to give minors confidential services without their parent's knowledge. On <u>www.plannedparenthood.com</u>, Ask Dr. Cullins, the question "What would be wrong with making teens

ask their parents for permission to use birth control?", is answered "Basically, it would lead to more teen pregnancy.....Unfortunately, not all young people can trust their parents to be helpful.Planned Parenthood believes confidential health care is a public health necessity –for the young as well as for adults."

- 3. They don't tell women that abortion can cause breast cancer, and that childbearing reduces the risk of breast cancer. They don't tell women that the use of oral contraceptives can cause breast cancer.
- 4. Instead of promoting abstinence to prevent HPV and cervical cancer, they are promoting the Gardasil Vaccine to "help reduce cervical cancer and genital warts." According the Gardasil website, HPV Types 16 and 18 cause 70% of cervical cancer cases, and HPV types 6 and 11 cause 90% of genital warts cases. Also according to the Gardasil website, "GARDASIL may not fully protect everyone and does not prevent all types of cervical cancer, so it is important to continue regular cervical cancer screenings. Anyone who is allergic to the ingredients of GARDASIL should not receive the vaccine. GAR-DASIL is not for women who are pregnant. GAR-DASIL will not treat these diseases and will not protect against diseases caused by other types of HPV. GARDASIL is given as 3 injections over 6 months and can cause pain, swelling, itching, and redness at the injection site, fever, nausea, and dizziness." Gardasil is not a cure all! The State of New Hampshire is giving this vaccine out voluntarily to girls at a cost of \$320 per vaccine. The cost will be borne by the taxpayer and insurance companies. No doubt Planned Parenthood used its influence to effect this outcome.
- 5. **PPNNE** <u>opposed</u> bills in the NH Legislature requiring parental consent before a pharmacist can dispense emergency contraception to a minor; to include "unborn child" in the definition of another for the purpose of first and second degree murder, manslaughter and negligent homicide; defining human life as beginning at the moment of fertilization; and creating an offense for the death of another resulting in miscarriage or stillbirth. They clearly oppose bills that could hurt their profits.

From Pg 1: The need for this provision is illustrated by Marcia Carroll, who testified on behalf of H.R. 748 during a previous Congress. When Mrs. Carroll was asked why she came to testify on behalf of CIANA at a Congressional hearing on March 3, 2005, she described how her daughter, without her knowledge, was pressured by her boyfriend's stepfather to take a train and cross state lines and have an abortion she didn't want to have, and which she now regrets. Mrs. Carroll said, "[my daughter] does suffer. She has gone to counseling for this. I just know that she cries and she wishes she could redo everything, relive that day over. It's just sad that it had to happen this way and this is what she had to go through. But she did want me to come here today and speak on her behalf. She said, 'Mom, just one phone call is all it would have taken to stop this from happening ...' So she asked me to come here for her sake and for other girls' safety to speak and let you know what was happening."

The abortion provider who performed an abortion on Mrs. Carroll's daughter had a long history of abusing his patients. Mrs. Carroll should have been given an opportunity to learn about the history of her child's doctor, who had been professionally disciplined multiple times for having sex with a patient in his office, for performing "improper" rectal and breast exams on two others, and for indiscriminately prescribing controlled dangerous substances. The parents of this country should be given the chance to make sure their children's doctors are not potential sexual abusers and controlled substance pushers, and CIANA would give them that chance.

As Mrs. Carroll testified, "I felt safe when [the police] told me my minor daughter had to be ... of age in the State of Pennsylvania to have an abortion without parental consent ... It never occurred to me that I would need to check the laws of other States around me. I thought as a resident of the State of Pennsylvania that she was protected by Pennsylvania State laws. Boy, was I ever wrong."

Abortion provider Dr. Lucero has also supported this legislation because "patients who receive abortions at out-of-state clinics frequently do not return for follow-up care, which can lead to dangerous complications." And sure enough, the abortion provider who performed an abortion on Mrs. Carroll's daughter failed to schedule a follow-up visit with her to help ensure there were no post-abortion complications.

The Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act would go a long way toward restoring parental rights and protecting the health and safety of our children.

State Rep. Maureen Mooney (Hills. #19) ... testimony to a bill that places a protective restriction on completely unregulated abortion practices in New Hampshire.

I anticipate that the opponents of this legislation will advance the familiar objection that "lethal injection" abortions do not take place in New Hampshire. Until this claim and others like it are verified, the abortion industry remains a "mystery,"

Bills like HB 1589 are not attempts to flirt with a constitutional challenge, but are attempts to impose regulations similar to other states, since we do not know what is going on within the N.H. abortion industry. What I am asking for are answers, compromise [from the NH House] and reasonable restrictions on a New Hampshire industry we know very little about and which I see the legislature going to great lengths to shield from any public scrutiny, and accountability. I have seen little attempts in the past to have the discussion on compromise, based on the following....

- New Hampshire is one of only very few states to not mandate abortion statistics. Several times, bills to mandate abortion statistics have been defeated. I once spoke with former Commissioner of Health and Human Services, John Stephen, who told me that federal grant money was available to states that mandate statistics, and still New Hampshire has none. See HB 1412 (2002), HB 1177 (2004), HB 1269 (2002), HB 439 (1997) and an amendment I proposed to HB 864 (2007).

- Abortion facilities in New Hampshire are not licensed. A bill Rep. Nancy Elliott (R-Merrimack) had last session to thoroughly do so failed. See HB 864 (2007). This bill would have also ensured that only licensed doctors perform abortions in New Hampshire. Without this bill, the question is left vague of who performs abortions in this state.

- Parental notification never came into effect in New Hampshire despite being signed into law, and was stripped by this committee last year. It was introduced in past sessions under SB 34 (1991), SB 456 (1992), HB 367 (1993), HB 1570 (1996), HB 1324 (1998), HB 1511 (2000), HB 1536 (2000), HB 763 (2003).

- Parental consent bills have failed several times. See SB 136 (1989), HB 766 (1991), SB 466 (1992), HB 1380 (2002), HB 1340 (2004), HB 399 (2005), HB 744 (2007).

- Informed consent bills have failed in this legislature. See SB 466 (1992), HB 1340 (2004), HB 399 (2005), HB 144 (2007), SB 442 (1998). [informed consent included risks of detrimental effects of abortion for women]

- A 24 hour waiting period before a woman obtains an abortion has failed. See HB 1278 (2002).
- A ban on partial-birth abortion failed in this legislature. See HB 1220 (2004), SB 54 (1999).
- Prohibiting state funds from assisting abortions was defeated in HB 1425 (1990), HB 1253 (2004), SB 77 (2007).

None of these bills regarding abortion accountability have passed. They've just been killed or in one case "postponed indefinitely." The pattern here speaks volumes -- abortion is a topic encased in an iron clad fortress, with a guarded gate. Many questions, no official, verified answers are ever obtained. Thus, the reason I used the word "mystery" when describing the abortion industry in New Hampshire.

Since we don't have verified answers, or accountability, or regulations, bills will continue to be introduced as precautionary measures until answers are obtained and we know for sure what is going on.

The Beatitudes

When you are insulted for the sake of God, do you count it a blessing? Perhaps it is difficult to be on the receiving end of nasty words or gestures, at least the first few times it happens. But I have found praying and witnessing at abortion clinics to be a great blessing. I've only been doing this sort of work for 15 months or so. The first time, it was to try to offer information to the girls that were going into Planned Parenthood to get Emergency Contraception. Planned Parenthood of Northern New England, and other PP's around the country, held a "Free EC" day, on which girls could come in and receive a dose of emergency contraception. It is my understanding that they were also giving this to young men, if they wanted it, so they could make it available to their partners.

The President of NHRTL created a brochure detailing the problems with EC and I brought some to the Derry location. I was so nervous! As usual, the anticipation was much worse than the actual "doing". There were other people there praying as well, asking God to save these girls who are doing harm to their souls and bodies. I offered brochures to 5 girls and got one taker. That girl and her boyfriend went into the clinic but quickly came out.

It is humbling work, seeing these kids going into Planned Parenthood and knowing that they are on the wide road that leads to destruction.

When you go pray at a clinic, expect both affirming words and insulting gestures. I believe that the more insults we get, the more good we are doing. After all, the devil is not silent on this issue and will always try to stop our doing good. But we serve the Lord, who tells us, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.
