NHRTL vs. PPNNE (Or, David vs. Goliath)

June 2011

The State of NH does not grant a \$1.8 million two-year contract with Planned Parenthood of New England (PPNNE).

September 2011

After saying there would be competitive bidding, Obama administration funds PPNNE for 16 months with \$1 million without any opportunity for competitive bidding.

April 2012

NH Right to Life files a complaint with state pharmacy officials charging PPNNE with illegally dispensing RU-486, birth control and other drugs.

August 2012

NH Board of Pharmacy unlawfully grants PPNNE an extension of their pharmacy license until November 1, 2012. The Pharmacy Board 'tabled' PP's application because PP failed to provide the required safety protocols.

September 2012

The Pharmacy Board secretly met and then publicly granted the licenses to Planned Parenthood based on a "confidential compliance memorandum." It appears the Board of Pharmacy (BOP) acknowledges that Planned Parenthood does not meet the statutory requirements for a pharmacy license but decided to give it to them anyway.

November 2012

NHRTL filed an appeal with the NH Supreme Court regarding the Pharmacy Board's granting of licenses to Planned Parenthood and a separate Right to Know Petition in Superior Court regarding the Board of Pharmacy's unlawful non-public sessions.

December 2012

In another secret non-public session, the BOP denied reconsideration claiming that NHRTL has no direct interest in the outcome of whether PP gets licenses.

### The War on Women?

Much has been made during the recent political season of what has been termed the "War on Women". Primarily this term was directed at Republican candidates but it unfortunately also was applied to Pro-Lifers. The claim was that to be pro-life was somehow to be anti-woman. There were the usual canards and hyperbole about "taking away choice" and "oppressing women" and other Planned Parenthood talking points. However, looking at facts and reality puts the "War on Women" in quite a different perspective.

Legalized surgical abortion in the United States has killed over 54.000.000 children in the womb since the Roe v. Wade decision of 1973. Assuming that half of these children were female then approximately 27,000,000 women have been killed by abortion. This figure is an underestimate since it does not include deaths resulting from pharmaceutical abortion, that is, using abortifacient chemicals such as RU-486 and socalled Emergency Contraception (Plan B) early in the pregnancy. Again it is reasonable to assume that half of these uncounted deaths were female children.

Internationally many more female infants in utero are aborted since males are considered more valuable in some cultures. Some statistics estimate that 100-200 million women are missing from the world because of sex-selective abortion and infanticide or what has been described as

"gendercide". Sadly the abortion industry has so much influence in Washington, D.C. that in May of this year a bill to outlaw sexselective abortion failed to get a two-thirds majority in the U.S. House.

Also the connection between

Abortion and Breast Cancer remains an area of contentious debate. As Wikipedia notes virtually all the big medical bodies claim that there is no scientific connection between abortion and increased risk of breast cancer. Yet why is there so much research the contrary? (See www.abortionbreastcancer.com for links and reviews) If this hypothesis is absolutely false as the big organizations claim, why is it so difficult to make it go away? If the National Cancer Institute, ACOG, American Cancer Society, et.al really care about the welfare of women then why don't they design and fund the best possible scientific study to prove and show the truth? To let women keep doing something that could increase their risk of breast cancer because we didn't get around to doing a good study seems unconscionable to me.

Much has been made about the "right" to free contraception. Again to oppose this is somehow to be against women. Yet as a medical doctor I have serious reservations about healthy women putting substances into their bodies that the World Health Organization (WHO) has classified as carcinogens, i.e. chemicals known to cause cancer in humans.

Also recent scientific work has raised concerns about the environmental pollution caused by contraceptives. Apparently some of these artificial chemicals are very resistant to waste water treatment methods and they are being released into the environment where they can cause havoc on the development of fish and amphibians causing an "intersex" anomaly. The problem worldwide now since contraceptive pills have become worldwide. The problem is so serious that in May of this year, **MSNBC** reported that European Union is seriously considering mandating the removal of one of the pollutants from waste water.

The whole "abortion mentality" has not helped the status of women. Since abortion has become legal men have come to see a baby as the woman's problem. Too many men feel no responsibility for their children and are more than willing to walk away with the attitude that since she didn't abort "it", it is her Additionally this problem. devaluing of human life, women, and the meaning and purpose of sexual intercourse has been associated with an increase in rates of domestic violence and "pro-choice violence".

Sadly the evidence does show that there is what could be described as a "War on Women". But until people start paying attention to where the enemy fire is coming from women and children will continue to be casualties.

# NHRTL PAC Report by Bill Smith, PAC Chairman

As disheartening as the November election results were, not all the news was bad.

Among the contributing factors, mostly beyond our control:

- Presidential election turnout, as always, was much higher than during off-year elections, such as 2010.
- Much of the higher turnout was "low-information" voters, who pay attention only during Presidential years, and who are easily sold (by misleading, emotional advertising) on bad ideas that sound good on the surface.
- The Republican Presidential candidate did not discuss "social" (moral) issues much (and in fact seldom pressed the Democratic candidate hard on \*any\* issues).
- So this turned out to be a nationalized, wave election, unfortunately rolling \*against\* conservatives (the opposite of 2010).
- Furthermore, NH House and Senate redistricting (which happens every 10 years), made reelection difficult for many good, pro-life NH incumbents.

HOWEVER, like Winston Churchill said during Britain's darkest hours, we must "never, never, never give up!"

There is good reason to be hopeful for the future. Politics runs in cycles. There will be waves in our direction again.

Many pro-life office-holders elected in 2010 (and earlier) gained valuable experience over the last two years. Many were reelected. Others will return to office later.

If we keep learning to be more effective and to speak more persuasively, we \*will\* win more hearts and minds, especially among young people, many of whom are open to the pro-life message. A recent American Thinker article by Trevor Thomas gives excellent examples of articulate answers about great moral issues, that we should learn to give, right off the tops of our heads

(www.americanthinker.com/2012/12/answering liberals gotcha questions.html):

"Often, when doubters were attempting to trap Jesus with their 'gotcha' questions, to reveal their ignorance and hypocrisy, Christ responded with a question of His own... There are several such questions with which to respond when asked why one does not support abortion in the case of a pregnancy resulting from rape... [O]ne should ask them: if I agree[d] to the rape exception, would you then agree to ban abortion in all other cases? Also point out that there are literally thousands of people alive today who were born as a result of a rape. (A good idea would be to name a specific example.) Ask if it would be acceptable to kill that person because of the circumstances of his or her conception. Another good question...would be: instead of killing the innocent child in the womb, why not execute the rapist? A follow-up would be: do liberals (or others) who support abortion in cases of rape also support the execution of rapists? Perhaps the best question would be, why compound one evil deed with another? Rape is a horrific evil, but so is the taking of an innocent life."

If we stand up for what's right, we \*will\* convince many others! There is always hope, if we trust in God and faithfully persevere! In the long run, with God on our side, who can stand against us?

## **Assisted Suicide: Get Informed**

Although pro-lifers tend to focus much effort on ending abortion, we must also strive to stop assisted suicide legislation from advancing. The recent so –called "death with dignity" ballot initiative in Massachusetts failed in November by a very slim margin. (51% to 49%) Rep. Charles Weed of Keene NH has introduced a LSR in the NH State Legislature which will become a bill in 2013. The title is "relative to death with dignity for certain persons suffering from a terminal condition". According to the Massachusetts Citizens for Life website, Oregon, which legalized Doctor Prescribed Death in 1997, has a suicide rate which is significantly higher than the national average. Do such laws lead to a social climate which encourages death as a solution to personal problems? Did you know that over 90% of terminally ill patients who attempt suicide also suffer from treatable depression?
